 charter school laws, CER's expert panel gives 19 states with strong laws As and Bs. Strong laws
 foster the development of numerous, genuinely independent charter schools. The 18 remaining
 states are weaker across the spectrum, precluding parents and children from fully benefiting from
 inclusion of charter schools in the public education system, and meriting them grades of C or
 below.

According to the <u>AP story (4/27/00)</u>, "States trying to promote charter schools are heading the wrong way if they don't give the special public schools ample freedom and funding, say supporters in a new report on state laws... CER - "whose newest analysis comes as charter school support widens and intensifies - examined states for policies it associates with strong charter school laws."

- National Charter School Directory 2000 is also out and the 280-plus page volume reflects the tremendous growth in charter schools nationwide. The new directory includes information on about 2,000 charter schools, year by year enrollment and growth trends and more!
- · Everyone is getting in the act! National Charter Schools Week will see visits to charters by

President Clinton, Vice President Gore and possibly even Tipper, too, sources say. Governor George Bush is planning on making a charter week visit, and here in Washington, DC, the <u>Congressional Salute to Charter Schools</u> has kicked off the issuing of proclamations and applause for charters. Last week the Senate passed a bill to free the district from major state regulations, but its fate throughout the rest of the legislative process is still uncertain.
