Note: The formula was created with individualized scores for each Element of Power and each was converted to a four-point scale and combined to make up an averaged GPA, which was then converted to a percentage of power for each state. The Charter Schools and School Choice categories were weighted as 75% of the overall grade. Bonus points were calculated based on whether a state has a parent trigger law, and whether or not information on schools and school board elections are transparent, or available to the public. States earn .05 for having a parent trigger law and .01 each for transparency of schools and school board elections, for a possible bonus total of .07. Ties are broken based on choice implementation and how influential these categories are on affording parents true power.
