But my best guess is that we'll get a bill and it will be 90 percent of what we want but will be obscured somewhat to the casual observer. That's just my guess. It could blow up. Hope not. This is the strangest session in recent history. Lots of other things swirling around that aren't good and unrelated to education. A good friend that knows told me he wouldn't be surprised if nothing significant passed.
